

Alexis Rosado

Biographical Note

Alexis Rosado is currently serving as Ambassador of Belize to the Republic of Guatemala and as non-resident Ambassador to Costa Rica, Honduras and Panama. He held the post of Chief Executive officer in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Belmopan for six years of which he also headed the joint Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade for four years. He currently serves as Co-Chair of the Belize-Guatemala Joint Commission and is Belize's Alternate Presidential Commissioner to CELAC and to SICA.

He served in other postings abroad where he was accredited to the United Kingdom as High Commissioner for Belize between 2002 to 2006, and as Ambassador to the European Commission and European Union between 2006 and 2008. He also served as Permanent Representative to the World Trade Organization (WTO) and as Ambassador to Belgium with concurrent representation to Spain and Germany.

Prior to his appointment as an ambassador he served in several capacities in the United Kingdom, Belgium and Geneva. He started his diplomatic career as a Foreign Service Officer in Belmopan where he was responsible for several desks including Central America, Asia Pacific, Europe and International Trade.

He has served in various organizations in Belize, including as a member of the National Security Council, as Chairman of the Foreign Assistance Committee of the National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO), and as a Director in the Boards of several organizations. He has contributed articles to several journals and conducted research on an range of issues related to Belize's international relations and development.

Mr. Rosado holds a Masters Degree in International and Comparative Legal Studies from SOAS, University of London; he completed graduate level diplomatic and foreign service studies at the Oxford University in the UK and from the Universidad de Costa Rica. His first degree in Economics was from Rockhurst, Missouri.

Alexis Rosado is fluent in English and Spanish. He was born on 22 August 1970. He is married with two children.
